

### RCMP Want to Hear From You

The Summer Village of Ma-Me-O Beach needs your help to ensure the needs of our village are met when it comes to RCMP presence, prevention and intervention. In order for the RCMP to appropriately schedule regular tours in our area, they must have data that reflects the activity in our village and to do so we are asking ALL RATEPAYERS AND VISITORS to be persistent in their reporting. Reporting crime and suspicious activities can help the RCMP identify and catch suspects, track crime trends and ensure the appropriate resources are deployed.

Keep in mind, there is no time limit on reporting a crime and anyone can report, including victims, witnesses or anyone with information. The RCMP are our partners in keeping our village safe and they are keen to help.

You can report a crime in person, over the telephone (RCMP Non-Emergency LIne: 780-312-7200 or 780-312-7267) and over the Internet (online: rcmp-grc.gc.ca). In addition, an Alberta RCMP app was recently launched to allow reporting via your smartphone. Depending on the urgency, choose the method that best suits your situation and makes you feel most comfortable. In case of emergency, please call 911 immediately.

Re: Ma-Me-O Beach Local Wastewater Project / Arbitration

The arbitration process between the Summer Village of Ma-Me-O Beach and PME was initiated mid-August 2021 and formally concluded in March 2023 after a series of delays and extensions.

On March 29, 2023, the Summer Village of Ma-Me-O Beach Council and Administration were notified that the arbitration efforts in relation to the wastewater project were unsuccessful. Two Special Council Meetings were held to review the results, the first with only Council and Administration while the second included our legal counsel.

At this time, the Ma-Me-O Beach wastewater project is on hold indefinitely as Council explores what options are available and devises an action plan for the near future and beyond in conjunction with various levels of government.

Council is committed to providing transparent and timely updates on its next steps, and the immediate focus is on cost-reduction activities to ensure the municipality can continue to support and serve its community.
